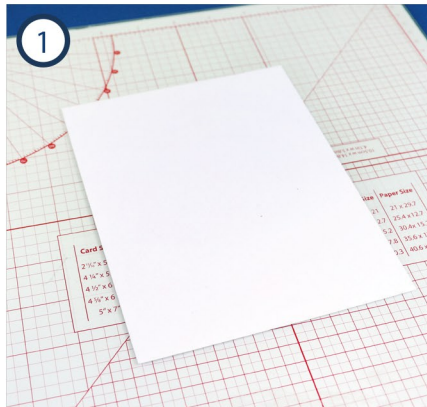
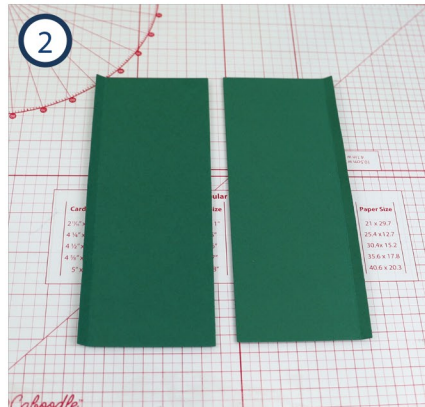


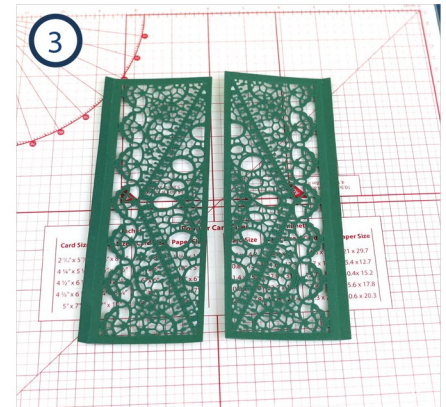
Fine Tryptic



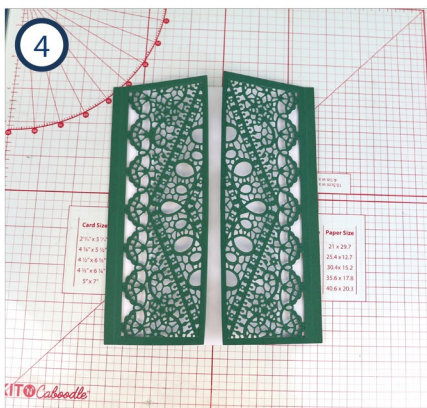
1 Cut the largest mat from your chosen cardstock to create a base.



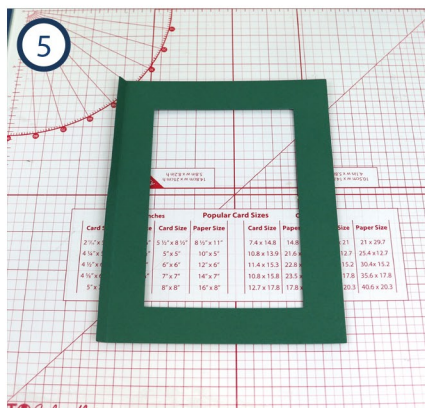
2 Cut two of the tabbed panels - this is the rectangular die with the built-in scoreline.



3 If desired, cut the lacy panel into the rectangles, ensuring that each mirrors the other.



4 Mat the panels onto the base in a double gate arrangement.

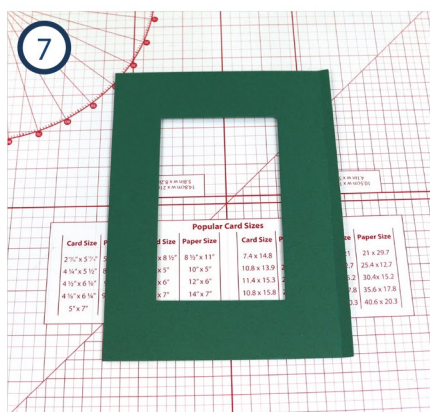


5 Cut the largest mat with the score line die inserted using the Link system. Place the score line die into the links beside the larger gap. Cut the larger rectangle aperture into the centre, measuring from the score line inwards.

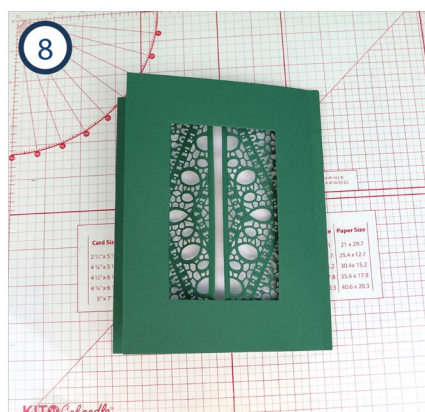


6 Cut another card front with both the score line and cutting line dies inserted into the Link system. This time, place the score line die into the links beside the smaller gap, and the cutting line die in the other links.

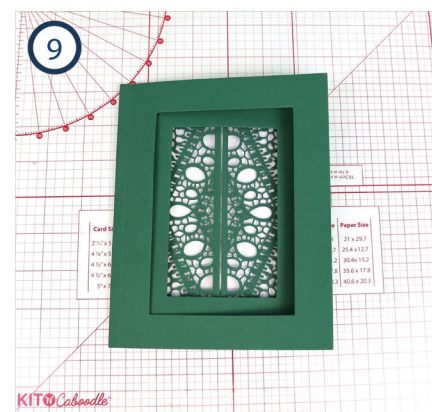

Cut the smaller rectangle aperture into the centre. Measure against the other aperture, ensuring this smaller aperture is central within it (see final step for reference).



Mat the card front with the smaller aperture onto the card, matting the tab onto only one side.



Mat the second panel onto the card, matting the tab onto the opposite side to the last to create a double gate fold.
