

Florentine Overload

Shopping list:

- D227 Florentine Over the edge 3 die
- D182 Lacy Daisy Die Set
- D214 Ornate Leaves Die Set
- D094 Sentimental Florals Die Set
- Cartouche Sentiments Stamp set
- Complimentary backing paper
- White cardstock
- Blue cardstock in various shades
- Broken China Distress Ink
- Peacock blue ribbon
- Crystal extra fine glitter

What you need to do:

1 Cut a piece of white cardstock measuring 32cm x 16cm. Fold in half to create a base card. Open the card out to work on the inside front of the card. It may help with the next stage if you draw a very faint pencil line down the centre as a guide. Place the Florentine Over The Edge 3 die into the centre, use stencil tape to prevent the die from slipping, cut it out. Release the die, remove all card waste and cut the other side to create a circle with a solid line through the centre.

2 Once the die cutting has been done, mask out the inside front of the card. Place two pieces of scrap paper underneath either side of the circle and more scraps at the top and bottom of the card. Lightly cover with a spray adhesive, remove the scraps of the card and glitter the circle.

3 Using a ruler and scoring tool score a line above and below the circle. Fold the card in and fold the card back on the score lines creating a fold back card with the circle popping out.



4 Cut a 15cm square from the complimentary backing paper and ink around the edges. Mat onto a 15.5cm square of blue card and stick onto the inside back of the card.

5 Die cut two to three sets of Lacy Daisies and a set of Ornate Leaves from various shades of blue cardstock and white cardstock. Also die cut some stamens from the Sentimental Florals die set. Ink the flowers with distress ink as shown and assemble the flowers.

6 Make up the composition as shown, adding glitter and ribbon loops as required. Use a decorative circle to embellish the centre of the Florentine die cut. Finally stamp a sentiment from the Cartouche Sentiments stamp set onto a small circle and attach to the centre of the circle.
